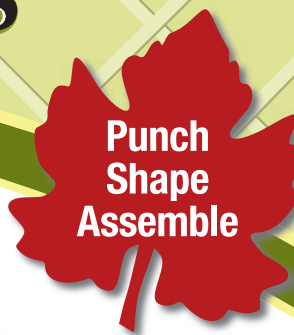

How To Make an Anemone

Anemone Supplies

Punches:

- 3 shapes Floriano 64002 in Blue
- 1 shape Alpine Snowflake 64500 in Green
- 1 shape Petite Petals 64007 in Blue
- 3 shapes Grape Leaf 64534 in Green
- 3 shapes Starburst 64512 in Black
- 6 shapes Daisy 73002 in Black

Tools:

- Paper Tool Kit and Case 65800
- Craft Molding Mat 65900



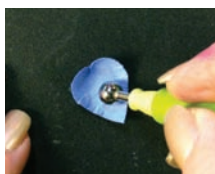
Additional:

- Cardstock: Med. Blue, Green, Black
- Pigment Ink - Royal Blue (Colorbox/ Clearsnap)
- Tim Holtz Distress Ink - Forest Moss (Ranger)
- Ink Blending Tool (Ranger)
- Finger Dauber (Tsukineko)
- Crafter's Pick Ultimate Adhesive
- Non-stick Craft Mat or Scrap Paper



Anemone Assembly

1. Using the Finger Dauber and Royal Blue Ink, color the Floriano shapes starting at the center of the flower and wiping out towards the edge of the petals. Allow to dry.
2. Cut all 3 Floriano shapes apart to separate all the petals. The Anemone flower uses 11 petal shapes.
3. Place the petal shapes face down on the molding mat and follow Technique #4 to cup the backs using the 8mm Ball Stylus.
4. Center the tip of the Tweezers over the pointed end of each shape and pinch paper around the Tweezers. The top half of the petal should roll back in the opposite direction.
5. Place the Alpine Snowflake and Petite Petals Star shapes on the Craft Molding Mat. With the #8mm Stylus follow Technique #1 to soften the shapes causing a slight curl.
6. Place a spot of glue on scrap paper or a non-stick craft mat. Dip the pinched end of 6 petals into glue and attach to the arms of the Alpine Snowflake to create one layer of petals.



7. Glue the last 5 petals to the points of the Petite Petals star shape. Allow to set. Then glue the 5 petal layer over the 6 petal layer offsetting petals to a pleasing arrangement.

(Caution: Don't use glue on or over the Craft Molding Mat. It needs to stay clean and dry.)

8. For the Anemone centers, place the 3 Starburst shapes and 6 Suns on the Craft Molding Mat. Follow Tech. #1 and #4 to shape and then cup the shapes.
9. Take the 3 Starburst shapes and snip the long arms off the shapes. Glue each shape together one over the other, offsetting the arms. Allow to dry.
10. Glue 2 Daisy shapes together one over the other. Take the 4 remaining Daisy shapes and pinch the base of each and roll to create a tight bunch. Glue together one over the other and then glue into the other Daisies to create a "pom-pom" effect in the center.



11. For the leaves, rub Forest Moss Ink around the edges of the leaf shapes with the Ink Blending Tool. Place each shape on the Craft Molding Mat and follow Technique #1 and #2 to prepare. Use the #1mm Stylus to add thin veining details to each leaf. Glue the leaves around the flower base to complete the Anemone.



Basic Techniques for Flower Making

Technique #1 – Shaping

Place a punched shape on the Craft Molding Mat. Press down with the 8mm ball stylus as you move stylus around in circular motion over card stock to soften.



Technique #2 – Pinching

Center the Tweezers over narrow the end of the shape. With thumb and index finger, pinch paper shape around the tweezers.



Technique #3 – Bending

Hold pinched end of shape between finger and thumb. With the Tweezers, grab the side of shape and roll back to form curve. Repeat on second side.



Technique #4 – Cupping

Place shape on the mat. With the 5mm stylus placed at 90° angle, press down & roll stylus around in center until the shape cups up.
